When plugged into a 115-volt AC appliance (up to 15 amp), the meter displays the number of kilowatts the appliance uses on an LCD screen.

The meter also can calculate the daily, weekly, monthly and annual costs of running the appliance and gauge the quality of your power by monitoring its voltage, line frequency and power factor. Cost: \$30.

## Polaroid offers instant digital prints

Want a pocket-sized printer to go with your pocket-size camera?

Polaroid may have just the thing: Its 8-ounce Digital Instant Mobile Photo Printer is compact and lightweight enough to tuck inside a slim pocket or bag. Better yet, it can spew out 2-inch-by-3-inch peel-off sticky-backed images in less than 60 seconds through a wireless Bluetooth or USB PictBridge connection with a digital camera.

The inkless printer relies on special white photo paper embedded with color that comes to life during the printing process. Power is provided through a built-in lithium-ion battery that is capable of producing 15 prints on one full charge. It will go on sale in the second half of this year for \$150. Prints will cost 30 to 35 cents each.
